 - 7. Urban structures in medieval Transylvania
 - 8. Political-military events in the life of medieval Transylvania
- 9. Cultural life in medieval Transylvania: 1. European artistic trends in architecture and painting
- 10. Cultural life in medieval Transylvania: 2. Formation of a local intellectual elite primary school, university study, book and reading
 - 11. Recapitulatory perspective: medieval Transylvania between East and West
