	EU and US. Furthermore, the study of crises that have impacted on the		
	partnership, but also the crises in the International System which required their		
	attention and action will be examined. Finally, the course aims to further		
	consolidate their research and academic skills as students will have to submit a		
	5000 words research paper.
